Andy's Corner¹

The Irish Experience

Have you wanted to take that trip to Ireland, but you don't know what to do or where to go? You probably want to see the pubs and try some grub. But, when you get there, don't be surprised if you hear our music and they are singing our songs. Three years ago, when I visited Ireland, we were in Cong, County Galway, home of Ashford Castle and Cohan's Pub. Both famous as backdrops for the movie "The Quiet Man." We had some dinner, had a few drinks at our hotel, Ryan's River Lodge, and some of us wanted to find an open pub. We were warned by the group leader that we would be leaving early in the morning to head to the Cliff of Moher. After giving his words the weight they were due, his sisters and I snuck down the stairs like teenagers and out into the night. Much to our disappointment Cohan's was closed for the evening, but across the street a man standing outside of the Danaher Hotel asked if we were looking for a pint and a song. Of course, we were. We followed him in. To our surprise he walked over to the corner, picked up a guitar, and sat next to a man with an accordion. Live music in a pub, this was great craic! I cannot recall what he played, but attention soon turned to Ol' Paddy sitting by the fire with his tin whistle. This was it; this would be *real* Irish music. As the words crept out in a low tone, I listened intently. I slowly made out the words as Paddy crooned about... THE MISSISSIPPI BLUES!!! I cannot say I did not enjoy it, but what a surprise. We had come 3,500 miles across the ocean to hear "American" music. The singer asked for requests from the few people remaining in the pub, and a group of younger people, encouraged by our presence, asked for "American Pie" and "Sweet Caroline." Over the past three years, I have followed some musicians from Ireland on social media, and this trend continues. While there is no shortage of places to find traditional music, you may just have to look a little harder these days.

If you find yourself in Ireland this month, you will need to reset your megalithic monuments for the next solar event as the bonfires of the midsummer celebrations (summer solstice) at Grange stone circle in County Limerick and the Hill of Tara have now cooled. However, later in the month, the north will be ablaze with bonfires commemorating the defeat King James II by William of Orange at the Battle of the Boyne. The Twelfth is marked by bonfires across the north on the eve of July 12th, and public processions the next day. This practice has long been a cause of tension and often violence since its origins in the late 18th century. The underlying conflict and history that came out of the Battle of the Boyne is fascinating, but I am not qualified to speak on its impact or the troubles between parties since. Instead, do yourself a favor and watch the PBS documentary "Once Upon a Time in Northern Ireland." You can easily find it by searching pbs.org. It tells the story of The Troubles from both sides, using ordinary people who lived through it.

Whatever your plans, home or abroad, experience something Irish. Don't wait for that bucket, just make a list and start crossing things off. There are Gaelic sports in Cleveland, Akron or Pittsburgh, the Flanagan sculpture at the Columbus Museum of Art, festivals of music and dancing across the Midwest, road bowling in West Virginia, and even canal boat rides (Ohio has several) on the big ditch dug by Irishmen. If all else fails, I'll see you at down at the pub, I suppose.
