October E-Board Meeting Highlights

• Fred Berkemer gave an update on bringing a representative from Choctaw Nation to Columbus to march in the parade in recognition of the special relationship between the Irish and the Choctaws. Background from Choctaw Nation website: "In 1847, when the Choctaws, who had only recently arrived over the ruinous "trail of tears and death" to what is now Oklahoma, took up a donation and collected over \$5,000(in today's money) to support the Irish during the Potato Famine". https://www.choctawnation.com/about/history/irish-connection/. Once Fred confirms Choctaw participation, he and his committee will start planning a fundraiser and marketing material.

- **Elevator Update:** Director McDonald and President Komatsu recently met with a Schindler Elevator representative who estimated the cost at \$110-\$120k. They are currently researching grant opportunities.
- Club Grounds Cleanup Day: Director McConahay is planning another grounds workday on Sunday, November 13th, to clean up the grounds before winter. There's lots of wood that needs to be split and cleared.
- Green Season Proclamation Day: Friday, March 10 Family Reunion Update: President Komatsu received the contract for Battelle Hall and will meet with our new Convention Center representative to finalize.
- **Drive-Thru Food Drive for Holy Family -** Saturday, December 3rd from 12pm-2pm.
- **Dublin Irish Festival Wrap-up:** the club made \$4697. The board discussed other fundraising opportunities; i.e.: concession staffing at sporting events and festivals, etc.


Competition Placings: 19 First Places, 12 Second Places, 3 Third Places.

The Gap of Destiny

Last month we shared the history behind God Save Ireland which until 1916 had been Ireland's national This month we continue with a story about the song which replace it as the Irish anthem. Written prior to the Uprising, Amhrán na bhFiann (A Soldier's Song), lyrics by Peader Kearney, was officially adopted by the Irish Free-State in 1926. For those of you who attended the June general meeting, you may have heard me tell the following story prior to our signing of the national anthems. I have always wondered the meaning of the phrase "bhearna bhaoil". These are the only two Gaelic words in the English version of the anthem. They must have some significance. Like our *Star-Spangled Banner*, the Irish national anthem, tells a story. One stanza references the bhearna bhaoil, translated "gap of destiny," which comes from the Battle of New Ross. The date of the battle was June 5th, coincidentally the same date as our June meeting. The battle was part of the 1798 Rebellion where the United Irishmen attempted to gain control of this Wexford town, a vital link to supplying the southeast. If the rebels were successful, they hoped to recruit support from Waterford, Cork, and Tipperary and continue the rebellion. First, they had to capture the well fortified town, and the attackers were an untrained mass of several thousand men (and women). Some were armed only with pikes, and what little artillery they had, they manned with captured British officers serving at pike-point. Hoping the defenders would yield to the larger force, a messenger was sent under truce. When he was shot, the battle began. A column of troops led by John Kelly ("the boy from Killane" immortalized in the ballad sung by Mossy Moran), was sent to attack the Three Bullet Gate, an entrance named from the Cromwellian Wars where three bullets had lodged in the masonry. Kelly hoped to distract the British and provide cover for his troops by sending a herd of cattle through the gate and into the streets. Kelly was wounded, but the maneuver worked. The troops entered and began fighting street by street with the British who would soon flee the town. This did not last long as they returned with a cavalry charge that was repelled by the pikemen. Back and forth it went until the untrained forces final fled back through the gate. Due to the fierce fighting, this gap of danger also became known as the "gap of destiny." New Ross was a highpoint for the rebellion, but history will remember it and the "bhearna" bhaoil" as a rallying cry for future generations. Come woe or wail, let's remember all those who fight for freedom.
