President's Message




Hello everyone! Were you here for the Halfway to St. Patrick's Day? If you were you know what a great time we had and if you weren't I am sorry you missed it. Check out our

God Save Ireland

God save Ireland, said the heroes God save Ireland, said they all Whether on the scaffold high Or the battlefield we die Oh, what matter when for Erin dear we fall	Climbed they up the rugged stair, rang their voices out in prayer Then with England's fatal cord around them cast Close beside the gallows tree kissed like brothers lovingly True to home and faith and freedom to the last

Every year on St. Patrick's Day at the Family Reunion, The Hooligans call all the current Officers and Past Presidents of the Shamrock Club onto the stage and we sing **God Save Ireland.** The following article by the AOH State Historian, Mike Finn, tells the story of that song.

"God Save Ireland" – The Manchester Martyrs

The Irish Republican Brotherhood Rising, also known as the Fenian Rising, began in Ireland and the Unites States in the spring of 1867. When the English suspended Habeas Corpus in Ireland, the Fenians decided to take the rising to England.

On September 11th, 1867 the police in Manchester, England arrested two men for vagrancy. The two were Colonel Thomas Kelly and Captain Timothy Deasy. Both men had served as officers in the US Civil War. What the police didn't know was that that they had inadvertently arrested two key leaders of the Fenian movement. They came to England to bring the fight for Irish freedom to British soil.

The men were held for a week and were on the verge of being released when a paid informer advised the police whom they are holding. The police then decided to move the prisoners to a more secure location. They placed the two men in a police

van along with other prisoners. Police Sergeant Charles Brett guarded them inside the locked van. Just outside the city of Manchester the van was attacked by a group of 30 Fenians, determined to rescue Kelly and Deasy.

After stopping the van and overcoming the drivers, the Fenians were unable to get into the locked van as Sergeant Brett held the keys and refused to pass them out. Someone suggested shooting the van's lock. A bullet was fired through the keyhole of the van. Unfortunately, Sergeant Brett chose that moment to look through the keyhole and he was killed instantly. A female prisoner in the van passed the Sergeant's keys outside. Kelly and Deasy were freed and the Fenians scattered. Kelly and Deasy were soon on board a ship bound for America.

"God Save Ireland" – The Manchester Martyrs, cont.

Following the raid, the Manchester police began a round up of Fenian suspects. Hundreds were arrested. The police used paid informants to identify five men. The five were tried for the murder of Sergeant Brett. None of the five men actually did the shooting. The five men who were:

Michael O'Brien – O'Brien was born in County Cork. He immigrated to America where he enlisted in the Union Army and served as a Captain in the Civil War. After the war he returned to Ireland.

William Phillip Allen – Allen was only 19 and a carpenter by trade. He was present when the van was attacked.

Michael Larkin – Larkin was a tradesman who had moved to London to find work. He was also present when the van was attacked.

Thomas Maguire – Maguire was a Royal Marine who was on leave at the time of his arrest. Maguire had been on board a British ship when the van was attacked.

Edward O'Meagher Condon – Condon was an American citizen. He had also served as an officer in the Union Army during the Civil War and was involved in the Fenian movement. He was present at the attack, but was not armed.

The five men were tried before a Special Commission, all were charged with the murder of Sergeant Brett. All pleaded innocent to the charge. Maguire and O'Brien presented evidence that they were elsewhere when the van was attacked; however, as the witnesses in their favor were also Irish the testimony was discounted. The court found all five defendants guilty. They were all sentenced to hang.

The defendants made eloquent statements at their sentencing. Edward O'Meagher Condon said, "I have nothing to regret, to retract, or to take back. I can only say, 'God save Ireland!'" At this, the other prisoners responded with "God Save Ireland!" This act provided the inspiration for T. D. Sullivan to write the Irish rebel song of the same name published on December 7, 1867. It became an anthem of the Fenian movement and is still popular today.

William Allan closed his sentencing remarks with "The man who has taken life, you have not got him." After the trial the British Home Secretary reviewed the case of **Thomas Maguire**, the Royal Marine. It was found that the government informer had indeed lied. Maguire was granted a Queen's pardon and released. This perjured testimony should have cast doubt on the legality of the other convictions.

Edward Condon's sentence was commuted to life imprisonment through the intervention of the American Ambassador to England, Charles Francis Adams (son of President John Quincy Adams) who insisted that Condon was an American citizen and should not be executed. Condon served 11 years in prison and was released in 1878.

On November 23, 1867 the three remaining defendants, **Michael Larkin, William Allen and Michael O'Brien** were all hanged at the New Bailey Jail in Manchester before a crowd of 10,000. Their bodies were buried together in quicklime behind the prison walls. So fearful were the authorities of a disturbance that 500 infantry, a squadron of Hussars and two batteries of artillery were brought in to guard the jail.

These three men became known around the world as the *Manchester Martyrs*. Their executions enraged public opinion against England in Ireland and the United States. The three men became Fenian martyrs and their deaths directly impacted the thinking of physical force republicanism for 150 years from Charles Stewart Parnell to Patrick Pearse to the Irish Republican Army. T. D. Sullivan's song helped to spread the inspirational story of the martyrs.

In 1991 their bodies were exhumed along with those of other executed criminals. It was impossible to identify the bodies. The bones were cremated and placed in a mass grave near the prison. There are many monuments to the *Manchester Martyrs* in Ireland; one is located in Glasnevin Cemetery near Dublin. As their song ends ...

Never till the latest day shall the memory pass away Of the gallant lives thus given for our land
