Chili Cook-Off



If you are interested in becoming one of the **Shamrock Club's Best Chili Cookers** and win the Silver Ladle 1st prize or a Silver Spoon (2nd and 3rd place) - enter this year's Chili Cook off. This year it will be held in conjunction with **Barktoberfest (October 14th)**

You will need to have your Chili at the Club no later than 5:15 pm. Judging will start at 5:30pm. It is best to bring your chili in a crock pot to keep it hot.

2 Separate Types: Mild and Spicy

Chili will be judged according to 5 criteria.

Chili will be rated on a scale 0-5 for each of the 5 categories

- 1. Color-Chili should look appetizing
- **2. Aroma-** Chili should smell good This also indicates what is in store when you taste it.
- **3. Consistency**-Chili must have a good ratio between sauce and meat. It should not be dry, watery, grainy, lumpy, or greasy.
- **4. Taste**-Taste above all else. Taste is the most important factor. The taste should consist of a combination of meat, species, etc. with no particular ingredient being dominant.
- **5. After-taste** The after-taste or bite is the heart created by the various types of spices and or peppers.
- **6.** Name-Name is unique and creative.

A People's Choice will also be awarded. Members can cast their votes for their favorite Chili. This voting will take place during the event.

To enter the cook off -Free (plus a free drink ticket).

To taste/judge- \$5 for 6 tastes (1 vote) or \$7 for 6 tastes (1 vote) plus a hot dog.



The Irish hunger strike of 1981 was one of the most tragic events to occur in Irish history. Hear from Shamrock Club member and author Mike Mentel, how the declassified documents illustrate how the 1981 hunger strike, and the ten men who died on it, forced a revolutionary change in the political and governmental structure of the north, forming a road to peace that concluded with the signing of the 1998 Good Friday Agreement. He has written a book called "The 1981 Irish Hunger Strike: An Account from Declassified British Documents" that is due to be released in November and is available for pre-order on Amazon.


